Water efficiency rebate ends in June

The average Minnesota resident uses about 52 gallons of water per person per day. In Shorewood, the average is over double this amount, at 115 gallons of water per person per day. In partnership with the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services and the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment, the City of Shorewood offers rebates to encourage residents to install toilets and irrigation components that reduce water use, as well as washing machines and dishwashers that are energy efficient. Rebates are processed in the order of which they are received and issued until the funds are used. Rebates must be submitted before June 30, 2024.

How much water do you use?

Making Sense of Local Government: Commissions and Advisory Boards

You may recall from past newsletters that the role of the City Council is to set the City's policies and direction, and that City staff implements those policies and directives, but have you ever wondered about the role of the City's commissions and advisory boards?

The Shorewood City Council and staff rely on several boards and commissions to provide insight, make recommendations, and otherwise advise or represent the City on a variety of topics important to the community. Commissions and boards are made up of residents appointed by the Council for staggered three-year terms. Generally, boards and commissions meet once per month or less.

The **Planning Commission** reviews matters related to land use within the City, such as changes in zoning, modifications to zoning code, updates of the comprehensive plan, and variance requests. City staff provide the Commission with a technical analysis of site plans, zoning regulations, or policy considerations. The Planning Commission reviews the analysis, takes public comment on the proposal, and then makes a recommendation to the City Council.

The **Park Commission** is charged by the City Council with planning for the long-term park and recreational needs of the City. This includes reviewing and planning for park use, maintenance, and improvements to park land and facilities. City staff work closely with the Commission to provide information and support.

The City also participates in other regional organizations that provide service to the community. City Council appoints a resident to serve on advisory boards in order to provide insight and perspective. These boards include:

Lake Minnetonka Communications Commission (LMCC) is a joint powers agency. The LMCC oversees the franchise agreement with the cable operator and promotes awareness and use of community television. LMCC video records council meetings and offers free production opportunities for community members.

Lake Minnetonka Conservation District comprises the fourteen communities bordering Lake Minnetonka. The district was formed in 1967 by the State legislature. The District's role is to protect, preserve and enhance the lake's environment, economy, and vitality.

Minnetonka Community Education Advisory Council provides guidance and insight into the programs and services provided by Community Education.

Residents volunteering to serve on commissions and boards often do so to become involved in their community and share their skills and talents. It is not uncommon for City Council members to have first served on a board or commission before deciding to run for elected office.

Please visit the City's website or call 952-960-7900 for more information about boards and commissions or to apply for appointment. The City Council generally reviews applications in February of each year but may review applications sooner if a vacancy occurs.

City Offices on the ballot in November

This year's General Election ballot will include one (1) Mayor and two (2) City Council seats. Terms are four (4) years beginning January of 2025. The filing dates for city offices depend on whether the city holds primaries or not. Shorewood does not hold a primary for city offices.

Candidates may file from July 30, 2024 until August 13, 2024 at 5:00 pm. Filing fees are \$2.00. You may file at Shorewood City Hall. Petitions in lieu of filing fees will be accepted. Candidate Filing Packets are available on the City's website under Elections. The Primary Election will be held on August 13, 2024, and the General Election will be held on November 5, 2024.

Special Election on May 14

Hennepin County has scheduled a Special Election for Tuesday, May 14, 2024, to fill the vacancy of Commissioner in District 6. This vacancy is the result of the resignation of Commissioner Chris LaTondresse, who announced his intention to depart the County Board effective September 21, 2023.

To find your polling place, visit pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us and enter in your address to find out where you vote on Election Day. You may vote absentee at City Hall during regular business hours Monday, May 6, through Monday, May 13, at 5:00 pm. City Hall will be open for voting on Saturday, May 11, from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm.

Zoning Permits

Many projects that don't require building permits require zoning permits. Improvements like driveways, patios, fences, sidewalks/steps, some retaining walls, pergolas, constructed (not portable) fire pits, etc. are all required to have zoning permits. Zoning permits are a low-cost permit and staff review the proposal and make sure it conforms to setbacks, impervious surface requirements, easement restrictions and the like. The City has a variety of information on what is required for many improvements. Submitting a request for a zoning permit is quick and easy through the city's online permit portal, which is located conveniently on the left side of the planning and protective inspections page of the city's website.

Recreational Fire Permits

Restricted recreational fires with a total diameter of 3 feet or less are allowed in the City by permit. Permits are free and expire on December 31 of the year in which they were issued. The Excelsior Fire Department processes all recreational fire permits. To apply for a recreational fire permit, visit excelsiorfire.org/permit-forms

Landscape Materials

The City prohibits dumping or placing of landscape materials in the public street or in the city right-of-way (ROW). Items must be stored on your property. Items in the street or ROW will be removed at the owner's expense.

Recycling Pick-Up

Shorewood pick-up dates are highlighted in blue. Mainland residents' recycling is picked up every Wednesday, and Island residents' on Thursday of recycling week.

Dogs in Shorewood

As per Section 700 of City Code, dog owners are required to:

- License all their dogs. Please note, that owning or keeping three or four dogs requires a Multiple Dog License. Owning or keeping more than four dogs on any one property is not permitted.
- Clean up any feces they create and dispose of it with trash (not organics recycling).
- Keep dogs from excessively barking.
- Keep dogs on a leash no greater than six feet when not on the owner's property. Being off leash in not is permitted in any of Shorewood's parks, but one is available nearby at Lake Minnewashta Regional Park.

If you see dogs barking excessively, running at large, or behaving badly, please call 911.

Water meter replacement project continues

The City is continuing the meter replacement project for residents on the municipal water system. There are several hundred meters that need replacement and there is no cost to residents. Residents on municipal water should watch their mail for a letter from Ferguson Waterworks. The letter will detail how affected homeowners can schedule an appointment for replacement. Thank you, everyone, for your cooperation.



Backyard Composting and Organics Recycling May 5-11 is International Compost Awareness Week!

Composting is one of the best opportunities to reduce our trash – about 25 percent of what we throw away is organic materials like food scraps and compostable paper that could be put to better use as compost. Composting involves collecting food scraps and non-recyclable paper to be turned into compost in a bin in your yard. This process creates a nutrient-rich material that can be used in gardens and landscaping projects. To learn more about how to compost at home, visit hennepin.us/composting.

Looking for a more convenient way to reduce the amount of your food waste that goes to landfills?

Consider participating in City of Shorewood's organics recycling program. Shorewood residents can take advantage of free residential organics drop-off sites in Shorewood and Deephaven. These drop-offs are free of charge, but residents must register. Once registered, participants receive instructions and the lock combination for the organics recycling cart. HOW DOES IT WORK?

- 1** Gather up all of your old files, tax returns, bank statements and any other secure papers you may have (newspapers and non-secure papers should be put in your recycling cart and not brought for shredding).
- 2** Bring the items in paper bags or boxes to the city hall parking lot (bags will be returned).
- 3** Follow the cones that will direct you in one driveway.
- 4** Stay in your vehicle. Volunteers will remove your paper for the shred truck.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



Event will close during dangerous weather.



You will drive your vehicle into our facility for the process, where our staff and volunteers will unload it for you. Witnessed destruction can happen at that time, if so desired.



Paper only. Please do not bring any three-ring binders, plastics, trash or other non-paper items.



NO PLASTIC BAGS!



All shredded paper is baled and shipped directly to the paper mill for recycling.



We make every effort to meet the shredding needs of residents. **If the truck fills, the event will close prior to 12PM.**

WHAT TO SHRED (& WHAT NOT TO)

Although opinions differ on exactly what to shred, basically know that you should shred any documents containing signatures, account numbers, social security numbers, credit information, and any legal or medical information (including tax forms, checks, pay stubs, etc.). General mail, catalogs and flyers do not need to be shredded, and are better recycled curbside.

When possible, tear off the account information or name and address, recycle the remaining paper rather than shredding the entire piece.
