Shorewood’s annual Spring Clean-Up and Paper Shred event took place on Saturday, May 20. Over 1,076 items and 5,680 pounds of materials were collected, disposed of, and recycled. Way to go, Shorewood!

Most of the bikes brought to Spring Clean-Up will be part of a shipment for Ghana. The bikes weighed in at approximately 950 lbs, which will account for a 5,300 lb reduction in CO2 emissions for Minnesota.

What is the Right-of-Way?

The right-of-way (ROW) includes the street and area on either side of the street used to support the use of the street (for example, the sidewalks, shoulders, and ditches) and by statute includes cartways, bicycle lanes, other dedicated right-of-way for travel purposes, and utility easements of local governments. It also includes the area below and above the roadway. The City is not responsible for damage to any item in the public right-of-way. Public property, trails, and public right-of-way should not be used for storage of equipment for home improvement projects. Visit our website to learn more.

TIPS TO RECYCLE BETTER



Broken children's toys, lawn chairs and laundry baskets are not recyclable curbside or at drop-offs. They must be trashed.



Reduce Packaging: Remember to use your low-waste shopping skills when preparing for vacation. Shop for staples like oatmeal, coffee, and snacks in bulk and avoid buying individually packaged foods for convenience. You can also dry or preserve your own fruits and vegetables or freeze meals to take with you. Since most camping situations involve a vehicle, it is easy to pack a few reusable containers and bring them back home. For hiking or biking trips, reuse lightweight containers or plastic bags rather than buying the disposable options of pre-packaged food.

Water Meter Replacement for Some

Residents of Shorewood on municipal water should watch their mail for a letter from Ferguson Waterworks within the next two weeks. Although not all residential water meters need to be replaced, several hundred properties are in need of a replacement part. Ferguson will send a letter to those affected and homeowners should call to schedule an appointment for the replacement. Thank you to the affected homeowners for getting an appointment scheduled as soon as possible after receiving the letter. There will be no cost to the homeowner for the repair.

Water Restrictions

Through September 30, residents on municipal water may only sprinkle or irrigate lawns, sod, seeded areas, gardens, shrubs or other vegetation before 11 am and after 4:30 pm. Failure to abide by this ordinance may result in a fine. This restriction does not affect hand watering or water toys. See the city website under Environment>Yard and Tree Care for complete information. Although owners with private wells are exempt, the city recommends only watering outside of these hours for most efficient watering and for water conservation.

Living close to parks and other recreation facilities is consistently related to higher physical activity levels for both adults and youth. Moreover, parks provide a connection to nature, which studies demonstrate relieves stress, strengthens interpersonal relationships and improves mental health.

In the United States, 86 percent of adults think it is helpful they and their families have access to the outdoors and nature during stressful times.

Did you know? The trails in Freeman park are scheduled to be repaved this year as well as a new trailhead connection from the Southeastern corner of the parking lot to the existing Lake Minnetonka Regional Trail.

Local park and recreation agencies collectively manage more than 11 million acres of open space across the United States.

In addition to helping connect people to nature, local parks foster environmental stewards who advocate for and protect our most precious public resources — our land, water, trees, open spaces and wildlife.

The City of Shorewood recently started the implementation of an Integrated Pest Management Plan. Learn more about this initiative on the city website.

According to NRPA's *The Economic Impact of Local Parks* report, local public park and recreation agencies in the United States generated nearly \$218 billion in economic activity and supported almost 1.3 million jobs that boosted labor income by more than \$68 billion from their operations and capital spending in 2019. Four in five U.S. adults say access to a nearby park, playground, open space or recreation center is an important factor in deciding where they want to live.

Great news! The City of Shorewood has 12 acres of parkland per 1,000 residents which is above the industry average.
